The Middle School: The Middle School bridges the gap between Primary and Upper Secondary. It commences once a student has successfully completed year 6 and proceeds to year 7.

During the Middle School years students are exposed to a broad variety of subjects: Mathematics, English Language, English Literature, French, Kiswahili, Arabic, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Geography, History, Business Studies, Economics, Art and Design, Information and Communication Technology (ICT), Physical Education and Life Skills. The culmination of this level is marked by the student's academic evaluation for the Cambridge Lower Secondary Programme Checkpoints at Grade 9.



The Senior School: Upon successful completion of Grade 9, the students then proceed to year 10 which is the introductory phase of the Senior School. At this level they are prepared for their IGCSEs, which is a two year course. Depending on the students' choices of subjects at Grade 9, they will sit for a minimum of eight IGCSE subjects at the end of year 11.

A-Level: This comprises both year 12 (Advanced Subsidiary Level) AS-Level and year 13 (Advanced Level) A-Level; after which students proceed to universities across the globe. The subjects offered at these levels are: Mathematics, Additional Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Psychology, History, Geography, Sociology, Business Studies, Economics, Accounting, Literature in English, Physical Education, Applied (ICT) Information and Communication Technology.
